**Testing time is the maximum amount of time allotted to students to complete the assessment. Most students finish well in advance of the allotted time.

***The testing window is a period in which districts administer the PARCC assessment; it is not the actual number of days it takes a student to test. School districts can choose which days within the testing windows that it wants to assess students. Please inquire with your district about the exact testing dates of the assessment.
